<u>English</u>

In English, we have started the year looking at traditional tales - fables. We have recognised the features of a fable and identified what a moral is. We have retold the story of the hare and the tortoise using a range of grammar features and we are currently writing our own fable. Newspaper report writing will be used to reinforce the children's understanding of how different types of information can be presented and will produce their own newspaper report. Poetry will be a focus in this autumn term, recognising the features of free verse and kenning style poetry to be able to produce a piece of poetry ourselves.

Every morning, we take on our vocabulary ninja challenge to help expand our vocabulary.

<u>Reading</u>

In year 3-4 we are promoting a love of reading. Could you please encourage your child to read regularly at home and sign their reading records?

We complete a comprehension reading task related to our class read 'The Butterfly Lion'. This helps us to improve our vocabulary and skills in inference, predictions, explaining, retrieving and summarising.

<u>Science</u>

In science, we are looking at teeth and digestion. We have identified the names of each tooth, the different functions and we have conducted an eggciting experiment to see what happens when we don't look after our teeth properly.

We will start looking at digestion soon with a very messy experiment to identify how our digestive system works.
